## HOMWORK CHALLENGES

### Science

Have you ever wished that you could see around corners? What if you were in a submarine and you wanted to see what was happening above? The answer: a periscope!

I challenge you to build your own working periscope. Lots of inspiration and 'how to' guides available online.



### Cook

Food was rationed during the war – this meant that people had to be creative with what they had. Can you recreate a typical dish that would have been eaten during the war? Examples might include Woolton Pie, meat loaf, carrot cookies or honey biscuits but there are plenty of others to choose from!



### Maths Challenges

Find out as many facts about World War II involving numbers as you can (countries, casualties, weapons, aircraft, soldiers, dates...to name but a few!)



### News Report

Design a news report for radio or television that tells people about an incident during the war. Listen to examples on You Tube for inspiration. Then record your final report!

### Create

Use a shoebox (or other small box) and create a scene from World War II – it could be related to land, air or sea battles, evacuation or home life.
