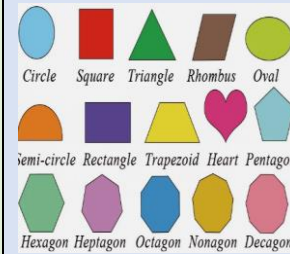
Homework Challenges

In Science we are investigating muscle fatigue. Can you take part in the Clothes Peg Challenge? You will need 1 clothes peg. Open and close the clothes peg as many times as possible within 30-second intervals (reps). Repeat this several times. Record the number of successful reps each 30 seconds. You will start to feel your finger muscles fatigue. What happens to your reps?
